A proposition to K.I.S.S – Lim Paik Yin (Tues 16 Nov – 5pm)

This year Pain Yin propose a series of loose threads for thoughts to collectively reflect on our practice mediated by the Internet.

A Matter of Form – Dr Eiichi Tosaki (Wed 17 Nov – 5pm)

We associate the concept of 'form' with Plato. Japanese 'kata' (like in Karate) is also well understood in terms of encapsulating 'form'. Practicing form has been an established way of enacting 'mastery', whether in the creative or martial arts.

The European Renaissance and the emergence of Noh Theatre in Japan (via Zeami) both emerged in the 14th century. A coincidence? Perhaps this can better be understood as a humanistic/artistic Zeitgeist.

Formalism was a trend in 20th Century Modernism. Kantian aesthetician Clement Greenberg was an advocate of 'Formalism' and was influential in pre- and post-War American art. I will not talk specifically about Modernism or Greenbergian formalism. Rather, I want to focus on 'form' itself and draw from both theoretical and experiential sources. This talk will be a dialogue based on discussion with Tony Yap (among others) freely mingling with the voices of dancers, musicians, and other art practitioners.

Key words include: Zeami, Derrida, Bergson, Kant, Greenberg, Raymond Duncan, Jazz and its improvisations.



Amandus Paul Panan holds a Master's Degree in Theatre and Bachelor's Degree in Filmmaking from the Universiti Teknologi MARA, Malaysia. He was the past President of a Dance Association in UiTM and has performed in the Universities Stage, off-campus dance productions, local Musicals, as well as in international folklore festivals. As a Kadzandusun and having lived in a village in Kota Belud, he grew up steeped in culture and traditions of his environment, understanding the mystical beliefs of the people and the underlying threads of mysticism in the people's way of life. He has translated these in his dances. Embodied with the experience of dancing various indigenous dances of Sabah, his forays into other dance genres including traditional Malay dances, contemporary dances, traditional Malay theatre as well as musical theatre, brought him into the realm of dance management when he became the Artistic Director of Anak Seni Production and Malaysia International Dance Organization (MIDO). Aman's interest in promoting Malaysian culture through dances has taken him and Anak Seni Production to several international virtual festivals including Indonesia Mask Festival 2021, Solo International Performing Arts Festival 2021, Singapore's Chingay Parade 2021, International Folklore Festival of Brazil - Children Edition 2021, and International Folklore Festival of Brazil 2021. His most recent work with Anak Seni Production and Anak Tari Jati Sabah was in Jangkar, which showcased 12 Contemporary dances piece inspired by indigenous traditions.

Chelsea Coon is an artist and writer whose work focuses on the shifting interconnections of the body, time, and space. She utilises endurance to reconsider limits of the body primarily through performance as well as installation, sculpture, painting, photography, video, and text. She has exhibited internationally in festivals, biennales, and galleries in North America, Europe, Asia, Africa, and the Middle East. She received her BFA at the School of the Museum of Fine Arts (2012), MFA at Tufts University (2014), and a Certificate of Advanced Studies in Theatre, Performance and Contemporary Live Arts at the University of Applied Sciences and Arts Scuola Teatro Dimitri, Switzerland (2015). Recent writings included her essay 'You Always Hurt the One You Love: Transference, Pain, Endurance' in Rated RX: Sheree Rose with and after Bob Flanagan (Ohio State University Press, 2020). She is a recipient of the Yousuf Karsh Prize in Photography (2013), Foundation for Contemporary Arts Emergency Grant (2015), and the Australian Research Training Program Scholarship (2019-2022). Coon is a PhD candidate in practice-led research at the Victorian College of the Arts, University of Melbourne.





This performance reveals aspects of my body's vulnerability in the precocity of pandemic-time. I sustain repetitive actions to pronounce the felt effects of this time in the context of sustained lockdowns where I live in Melbourne, Australia which feels like existing in a state of temporal suspension. This performance contemplates the dynamic ways experience of space, time, and the body continue to shift, and reflects on how extreme circumstances are endured.

Dan Wei (China/Australia)

I am a Chinese-Australian contemporary artist who makes installations, performances and drawings. Having worked with children for several years as a teacher, I have come to appreciate imagination, childlikeness and play which is infused into all the art I create. I use digital technology to create interactive installations to invite people to play and explore. Creativity, nature, art and technology are prominent schemes of my co-making workshops I facilitate for children. Inspired by nature, surrealism and magic realism, my work brings a nuance of poetry and curiosity to life that sometimes seems mundane and tragic. My performance is sensual and contemplative and shares my belief that now more than ever there is a need for this embodied feminine energy these qualities represent to be restored at both the individual and collective level. Importantly, I make art to provide a voice to underrepresented people in society, whether it be girls interested in pursuing STEM careers or women and disappearing folk and indigenous culture in a post-colonial era. My artwork involves projection and video art. Examples include Kaleidoscope, which exhibited in New York City 2016, and Tadpoles Looking For Mama, shown in Melbourne 2019, and a series of videos made during lockdown this year which can all be found on my website.

B-Grade Dual Magic



Love & intestine on the earth


(20 mins) – dance

This is because when we do something together with our bodies, it is easier for us to get along across language, race, and religion than when we just talk together. It is like when children are playing, they don't know what they are doing, but they are doing something together. Even though we have become adults and only use words, we can share that feeling and become friends with others as easily as we did when we were children. And basically, this improvisation will be done on the streets of the city. The idea is to make people smile a little, to stop their time for a while, to give them a little surprise. And this improvisation changes the universe.





A Thousand Blind Windows


